


0921 - "enemy in sight" from HMS Belfast

1945 - battlecruiser Scharnhorst sunk











HIVIS Sheffield

- 5 1205 second radar contact, 1221 cruisers open fire, Norfolk damaged
- 6 Cruiser stern chase




